Key conclusion 1	Harmful patriarchal practices and traditions being perpetrated by women and men in some communities. They do not feel this is wrong in any way.
Key conclusion 2	Unawareness of the legal implications of forcing someone to marry, or of the perpetration of honour related abuse. There is a sentiment of not caring about the consequences as this only adds to family honour.
Key conclusion 3	Although educational advancements have been made for males and females, the women are still the upholders of the honour of the family, and therefore the main victims of honour related abuse.
